Jacquie contacted the broker she clarified we would need a qualified 1st Aid Person on site, buoyancy aids and life jackets – we need to provide them information about how the club functions, and look at writing that into our policy. Jacquie explained that we sail in enclosed waters, and follow Waterway Rules:
 - Phil - we need to look at Cruising vs. Racing – every activity we run – addressing the liability – put a clause in our membership application instead of signing at every event. The relevant authority.
 - We are trying to avoid our cruising people having to wear a life jacket. Might create a bit of paperwork in the long run. If you are going on a cruise you acknowledge that issue.
 - Under this new policy all racing boats will have to wear life jackets. We are aiming to write a clause to accept the conditions.
- The Treasurer asked the meeting if we could pay the current insurance invoice of \$1,052.42 before 24 September and continue to fine tune after that.

Camp /Sail weekend. OTB's Welcome



Camping:

Bring your caravan, camper or tent. At time of publication, 4 powered van sites and all unpowered sites are available. Note: Camping is a 2 night minimum.

Trailer Sailors:

Drop in at Rathmines or the ramp of your choosing and sail/motor to Wangi Park jetty. Meet and greet around 12 noon Saturday.

OTB's:

Rig and launch at Wangi Park. There is room along the foreshore, but the ramp is in poor condition. OK for small trailers or beach wheels. Book a camp site for your tent or camper.

Unfortunately, camp fires are not permitted during daylight saving in the park, however I've managed to



book site 35 and secure a group booking. If you book under our group name "NHTYA" park staff will put us together along the ridge which overlooks the water. (Shown below above the blue line).

Around 12 noon the boats will head off for a sail to a location to be determined by conditions of the day. I will be acting as OTB support boat on Macnifique so no need to take a paddle. If you'd like to leave refreshments on the MAC, there's plenty of room in the fridge.

For those just camping, the Wangi Point reserve offers a nice bush walk or you could visit the old WW2 anti-aircraft placement nearby.

Saturday evening for dinner you can either cook or visit one of the local take-aways. Chinese was a great choice last visit.

Sunday, I'd like to sail to Pulbah for lunch weather permitting.

Some decided to go for a quick play and of course Brian held a Weta appreciation session with members- big smiles.



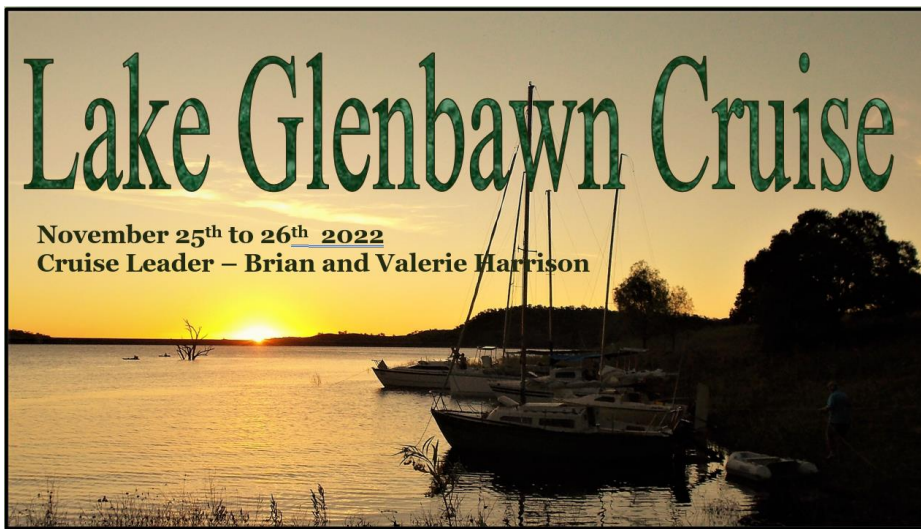
Lots of fun and grins all round. And then there was THUNDER ! That made everyone scamper

Lake Glenbawn is a dam its situated on the Hunter River about 20 kilometres east of Scone

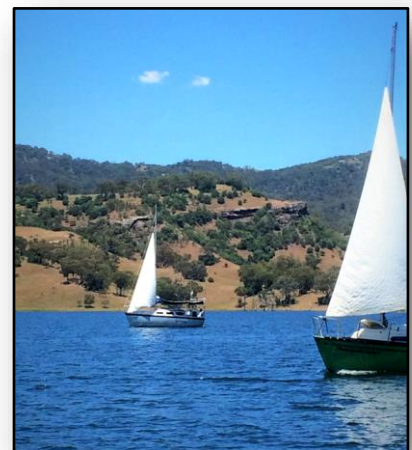
in the NSW Hunter Valley. The lake is a popular inland sport and recreation destination near Scone, offering year-round attractions for water sports and fishing enthusiasts, nature lovers, bushwalkers, campers and picnickers

Well, its time again to venture inland. The dam is now full so very different scenes from last time.

Come join us sail this picturesque lake. This time of year still allows us to have a campfire (as long as its not a fire ban !)



Lake Glenbawn is sometimes a forgotten place for us to sail and sometimes the winds can be very light! However, the scenery makes up for everything.



We'll be finding a lunch spot somewhere or even raft up and drift down the lake whilst eating lunch. Overnight depends on what we find! Everywhere you look its breathtaking!!!



Where we launch is almost designed for trailer sailers- nice and flat and no overhead trees. Plenty of parking and rigging space.

CRUISE DETAILS;

- *Brian and I will be launching on the Friday arvo/night (depending on when I can knock off work) and I have been informed some others will also.*

We are aiming for a 10:30am kick off on the Saturday so if you're coming and haven't told us please don't expect us to wait for you if something has happened to hold you up ☺. However, in saying that, if you do turn up late or Sat arvo we'll have the radio on and you can't get lost- just keep sailing/motoring up to the end of the dam- you'll find us ☺.

- *The park office is open from 9am to 5pm and they will provide you an access code and map when you pay. \$31 a night for two people. However, we will be booking a non-powered camp site online with our car rego and request for the access code in the comment field. If this is done by the Wednesday before we'll have our access code emailed to us before Friday. Please feel free to do the same, especially if you plan on getting there late Friday arvo !*

- *We will be launching from 'Diamond Point' boat ramp. Upon entry to the park the ramp is about 5km in. So if you think you've missed it keep driving. It is the second ramp up by the fishing club- you can't go any further !!!*
- *The park kiosk will be closed but they will have ice and worms!!*
- *There are toilet facilities in the park about a 5 min walk up the hill from where we launch, but there will be NO toilet facilities on the dam or where we are staying overnight.*
- *You will need to be completely self-sufficient. There are no lights other than the moon and campfire. YES, a campfire so please bring some wood.*
- *There are NO shops or anybody around except us and perhaps a cow.*
- *You will need some way of securing your stern. Either by stern anchor or star picket or ? But there is NO tide ☺. Of course, anchor from the bow. Long ropes to secure your boat to land from the bow is also wise.*
- *Although you'll be able to beach, stern in very close if you have a princess plank consider bringing it.*
- *Chairs for happy hour is compulsory ☺*

OTBs

- *Members with an OTB boat are welcome to join us.*
- *Basically, you can camp where you like, either where we launch or have your camping gear stowed on a trailer sailer to join the trailer sailer camp somewhere on the dam shore.*
- *Another option is to secure a berth on a trailer sailer and leave the OTB at home or have it towed!*
