Race Report Race 4 by Rob and Sybil on 'AQUILA'

Race 4 of the Autumn series began on a very still day with little or no wind. A good field of twelve boats started. The original course was to sail to Coon Island, Slip, Carey Bay, Marks Point, Coal Point and then home.

The start for the race was moved out into Kilaben bay to allow more room and have a shorter trip home. All boats started together with little or no wind. Every boat managed to creep across the start line and slowly drift across Kilaben Bay.

Once we reached the mouth of the bay the wind died completely leaving all boats just bobbing on the lake with no forward movement or steerage. Neville and Judy almost came to grief he two large stink boats roared past pushing them onto a moored cruiser. With great finesse they managed to fend off the cruiser and resume the race, although at one stage Neville was tempted to get out the iron horse.

The whole fleet sat motionless for about an hour or so. With no immediate relief in sight Chris decided to shorten the race around Coon Island and home. It was a great relief then the breeze picked up and we could all make some progress. The easterly breeze enabled us to set a course for Coon Island. Some boats (including us) veered to the south of Coon Island and then tacked north enjoying a nice reach to the marker. Other boats went further north and headed straight for the marker.

All boats were strung out in a line as they headed for home. Windsor Castle hoisted the spinnaker and were soon in the lead. With the wind picking up we were able to sail to the finish line in good time. Windsor Castle finished first across the line followed by Second One and RnR third across.

Extracted from NHTYA constitution dated February 2012

16. Constitution and membership of the Management Committee

- (1) The Management Committee is to consist of.
 - a) the office bearers of the association, and
 - b) 3 ordinary members, each of whom is to be elected at the annual general meeting of the association under rule 17.
- (2) The office bearers of the association are to be:
 - a) the commodore
 - b) the vice-commodore
 - c) the past-commodore
 - d) the treasurer, and
- e) the secretary
- (3) Each member of the committee is, subject to these rules, to hold office until the conclusion of the annual general meeting following the date of the member's

election, but is eligible for re-election subject to rule 16(4).

(4) In the event of a casual vacancy occurring in the membership of the committee, the committee may appoint a member of the association to fill the vacancy and the

member so appointed is to hold office, subject to these rules, until the conclusion of the annual general meeting next following the date of the appointment.

17. Election of members

the

- (1) Nominations of candidates for election as office bearers of the association or as ordinary members of the committee:
 - a) Must be made in writing, signed by 2 members of the association and accompanied by the written consent of the candidate (which may be endorsed on

form of the nomination), and

- b) must be delivered to the secretary of the association prior to the commencement of the annual general meeting at which the election is to take place.
- (2) If insufficient nominations are received to fill all vacancies on the committee, the candidates nominated are taken to be elected.
- (3) If insufficient nominations are received, any vacant positions remaining on the committee are taken to be casual vacancies and filled in accordance with rule 16(4).
- (4) If the number of nominations received is equal to the number of vacancies to be filled, the persons nominated are taken to be elected.
- (5) If the number of nominations received exceeds the number of vacancies to be filled, a ballot is to be held.
- (6) The ballot for the election of office bearers and ordinary members of the committee is to be conducted at the annual general meeting in such usual and proper manner as the committee may direct.
