NEW YEARS EVE GET TOGETHER



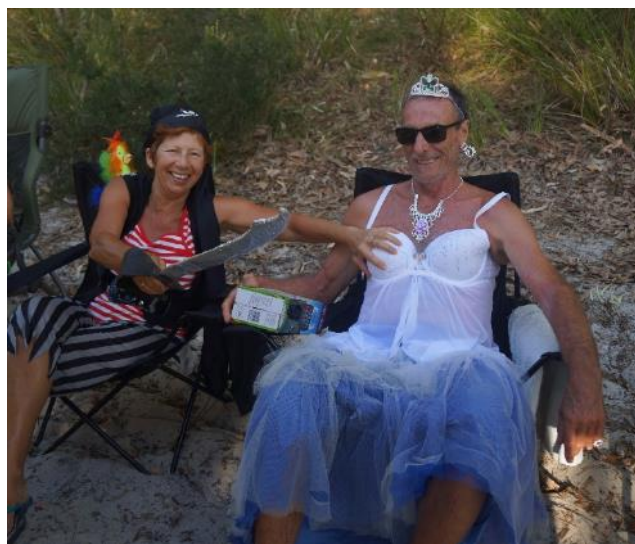
