

Adventure n. risk; bold undertaking; spirit of adventure; an unusual experience. Collins English Dictionary

The above definition almost sums up the experience that three club boats (Only Time, Déjà Vu, Crosswind along with Macnifique as support vessel) had on Saturday night 9th July, what is missing is the absolute delight of sailing on Lake Mac under a full moon, for some it would appear a daunting task way out of their comfort

zone, for others it's too cold to go sailing in the middle of winter, John Ferguson who crewed for me had a ball, yes it was cold but we knew it would be and came prepared for a chilly night but in reality it was not to bad once you got out there and settled into night adventure mode.

I arrived at Styles in the early afternoon, the wind was from the west nor west as forecast and it was sunny and cool, I stood the mast up and decided to wait and see who would turn up before I completed rigging the boat, by two thirty, Only Time and Macnifique had arrived and discussion was had as to would we sail or not as I expected more boats to turn up that did, well we launched the three boats and as we were about to leave Styles to go around to the F jetty Crosswind arrived so that made three starters, all good.





Brian set up the start line between the F Jetty and the communication tower at Kilaben Bay, the course was start ,Andersons, Cardiff Point, Coal Point and finish near the F Jetty, all of the rounding marks should have been lit at night, so at around five O,clock in a dying breeze we took off after a one minute countdown from Only time, the three boats sailing down wind, gull winged trying to catch what breeze there was, Only Time who also had Warren on board took the lead followed by Déjà Vu and Crosswind, the best we did up along Coal point was around two Knots, as we got to the isolated danger mark on Coal Point it was by now very dark and the breeze had picked up somewhat and we were now doing around four to five knots on a reach over to Andersons, the name of the game was to keep a good lookout for other vessels which were few and to find and follow Only Times stern light(I had a GPS on board with all of the LMYC marks on it so I had a very good idea were to head) Crosswind drew ahead of us before the Andersons mark and rounded just ahead of us, they took a dig at the mark tacking back out into the lake, as we rounded we kept on the

same tack hardening up to take advantage of the breeze which was around the 8 to 10 knot range.

While on the reach to Andersons we all heard a funny conversation come over the VHF on 72 it went like this, (Boat A) I can't find your lights, (Boat B) I have them all on, (Boat A) I still can't see them, (Boat B) they are

bloody well on look for them you Richard Cranium, (Boat A) still can't see them, (Boat B) really getting up tight by now says I will turn the bloody things off can you see me now?, (Boat A) still can't see them,(Boat B) I xydbek& give up. It was funny at the time and I guess you had to be there.

Back to the Adventure

We now had two stern lights to follow which was good, we tacked our way up to where the GPS was telling me the Cardiff mark was, Crossfire was also working up to the mark, when we arrived in the area no lit mark was to be found but we spotted it by torchlight and rounded just ahead of Crosswind, it was another reach over to the Coal Point mark and Crosswind took off leaving us once again to follow his stern light, by this time Only Time was way ahead and just another winking white light in the distance, as Crosswind passed us on the reach she was lit up by the full moon on her sails and with the moon reflection on the water it was something to see, by the time I got a camera ready the moment had passed alas all I got was a dark blob, as we approached



Coal Point we could see the mark winking away at us and around we went on another down wind run to the end of Coal Point, as we rounded Coal Point we found we had good breeze and started to work our way up to the finish, Crosswind called and said their Goodnights and headed off to home, it was a two tack work up the bay and as we reached the bowling club the wind dropped out completely, so it was decided to motor the rest of the way back to the F jetty where Brian, Valerie and Warren where ready to give us a hand to moor for the night, so we got back to the F Jetty at around 8.30 so were out there for around three and a half hours all be it a little chilly but what a great thing we experienced, the night was clear, the moon was magnificent and the breeze was perfect and the company great.

I would Like to thank Brian and Valerie for a experience I will not forget for quite a while and I hope we can do it all again next year.

Thanks also to John my crew for the night, Warren for the support vessel although not used as such it's the thought that counts and lastly Graeme and Charmaine on Crosswind



The Trip of the Year

Every year Kim wants to go somewhere and again I have let her talk me into going NORTH to Fraser Island and spend the extended stay to make sure we see as many WHALES as possible (yes we will keep 100m from them;)

We intend sailing from the Mon 28th to Fri 8th and travelling over the rest.

It is still open to anyone that would like to join us.

Where are we going - THE GREAT SANDY STRAITS, Tin Can Bay, Garry's Anchorage, Burrum Heads, Kingfisher Resort, Awinya Creek, Hervey Bay, Moon Point, Coongul Creek, Inskip Point, Ungowa, Big Woody Island, Wathumba Creek

Fraser Island stretches over 123 kilometres in length and 22 kilometres at its widest point. With an area of 184 000 hectares it is the largest sand island in the world.

<u>The Butchulla people</u> are the indigenous people of Fraser Island. There were six clans in the Butchulla Nation and the territory extended through Fraser Island, Double Island Point, Tin Can Bay, Bauple Mountain and north to a point at Burrum Heads in Queensland.

The Butchulla people's traditional name for Fraser Island was K'gari which means paradise. According to Butchulla legend, Fraser Island was named K'gari after the beautiful spirit who helped Yindingie, messenger of the great god Beeral, create the land. As a reward to K'gari for her help Beeral changed her into an idyllic island with trees, flowers and lakes. He put birds, animals and people on the island to keep her company.

Generally humpback whales are off the Queensland coast between late Autumn and late Spring. They turn south in July and August with about a quarter of the population entering Hervey Bay where they create a unique whale watching opportunity between August and October. An added feature of watching whales on their southern migration is the chance of seeing mothers with their newborn calves.

We are going and several other club members have indicated that they will be joining us, IT IS OPEN TO ALL just let us know if you would like to attend and we will keep you in the loop, it's never too late to say count us in.


