Special General Meeting Paper

Item: Review of Monthly Meeting Venue and Format

1. Purpose of Motion

The purpose of this paper is to present options for the future format and venue of monthly Association meetings and to seek member direction on whether the current arrangement at Club Macquarie should continue or be modified.

2. Background

The Association has held its monthly meetings at Club Macquarie for a number of years, following earlier periods where meetings were held at various locations.

Under the current arrangement:

- Meetings are conducted in a hybrid format (in-person and via Zoom).
- Typical in-person attendance has declined to approximately **2–4 members**, while Zoom attendance has increased.
- A formal understanding exists whereby **10–12 members attend pre-meeting dinner and drinks**, enabling use of the meeting room at no direct cost to the Association.

While this arrangement has served the Association well, changing attendance patterns and member engagement indicate that a review is appropriate to ensure meetings remain accessible, relevant, and sustainable.

3. Key Considerations

In reviewing the current arrangement, the Committee has considered the following:

- Declining in-person attendance at monthly meetings
 - Increased reliance on Zoom for member participation
 - The ongoing expectation placed on a small group of members to support pre-meeting dinners
 - Accessibility and travel considerations for members across the region
 - The value of face-to-face interaction and social connection
 - Cost and administrative implications

4. Options for Member Consideration

Option 1: Continue Monthly Hybrid Meetings at Club Macquarie (Status Quo)

Description:

Maintain the current arrangement of monthly meetings at Club Macquarie with hybrid access and continued pre-meeting dinners.

Implications:

- Provides continuity and familiarity
 - Maintains strong relationship with Club Macquarie
 - No direct meeting room cost
 - Does not address declining in-person attendance
 - Continues reliance on a small number of members to attend dinner

Option 2: Monthly Zoom Meetings with Quarterly In-Person Meetings at Club Macquarie**Description:**

Conduct routine monthly meetings via Zoom, with four in-person meetings per year at Club Macquarie (e.g. **AGM** plus three others), promoted as social and strategic gatherings.

Implications:

- Aligns meeting format with current attendance trends
 - Reduces ongoing burden associated with monthly dinners
 - Retains regular use of Club Macquarie and the Association's relationship with the Club
 - Reduces frequency of face-to-face meetings
-

Option 3: Continue Monthly Meetings at CM Without Expectation of Pre-Meeting Dinners**Description:**

Maintain monthly meetings at CM but remove any implied expectation that members attend pre-meeting dinners. Meeting room hire costs, if applicable, would be met by the Association.

Implications:

- More equitable arrangement for members
 - Retains physical meeting venue
 - Potential increase in Association expenses
 - Will require renegotiation with Club Macquarie
-

Option 4: Fully Online Monthly Meetings; Club Macquarie Used for Social or Special Events Only

Description:

Conduct all monthly meetings via Zoom, with Club Macquarie used for occasional social events, information evenings, or special gatherings.

Implications:

- Maximises accessibility for members
 - Lowest ongoing cost
 - Reflects current participation behaviour
 - Reduces regular face-to-face engagement
 - Changes the nature of the Association's relationship with Club Macquarie
-

5. Committee Recommendation

The Committee recommends that members consider **Options 2, 3, or 4** as viable alternatives to the current arrangement, noting the clear shift toward online participation.

The Committee further recommends that, should a change be supported:

- The preferred option be **trialled for a period of 6–12 months**, and
 - The arrangement be formally reviewed at the conclusion of the trial period.

6. Proposed Resolution

That the Newcastle Hunter Trailer Yacht Association adopts a revised format and/or venue for monthly meetings, as determined by the preference of members at this Special General Meeting, with the new arrangement to be reviewed after a trial period of up to 12 months.

7. Supporting Information

A member survey has been prepared to inform discussion and voting at the SGM and to guide implementation following the meeting.

On Sunday, 8 Feb, we started the briefing early with a rules update from Brian with his improvised bathtime boats. We can see where he's been practicing!

After 20 minutes of struggle on a pitching foredeck, we were able to drop the now torn sail. The second race was in a calming breeze with a smaller fleet.

WHY YOU NEED THE CLUB

I was recently recommended a book by a good friend after I had been discussing some of life's recent difficulties. The book is called "The Resilience Shield" written by Dr Dan Pronk and a few others. Dr Pronk was a medical doctor with the Australian SAS. I've been able to recommend this book to other friends and family who have also found it extremely helpful.

There are two benefits of having strong personal resilience. It makes you more tolerant to emotional damage when you are suddenly confronted with difficult circumstances and it also helps you recover more quickly from a big hit. The book explains why some problems are just so complex and defy logical solutions. But what got me hooked was when the author said that those who feel overwhelmed are a third less effective. I could certainly do with that extra 33%!

The book explains that there are five layers in building our resilience. The Innate (personality and upbringing), Physical, Mental, Social and Professional layers and the chapters explore each of these.

Of importance to us as a club, was the role of the Social Layer to each of us individually. We each belong to number of social groups. Our own family units, sporting and special interest clubs and other groups. Each social group has its own formal and informal rules, identity and practices. Your social groups provide friends, a safe environment for conversations and the building of supportive relationships. The book uses the example of a Veterans soccer team where one member expressed that the team had saved his life as he struggled with re-integration and post trauma issues. It's the depth of friendships that is more important than the number of friends.

I reflected on the role of the NHTYA and how it adds to my social layer resilience. Kerry and I have been members now for 12 years (excluding a 3-year period in the mid 1980's) and like most in the club have expressed, it's the other members that makes the club great. It also explains why the club's social events and practices are currently so popular. The more formal Presentation Nights, October Long weekends, the Xmas and Myalls New Years Eve parties. But the informal social events are also popular such as after race happy hours, the group table at the Catalina Club for race weekend Saturday dinner and the Sunday morning breakfast in the park. We also value the monthly newsletter, the banter on the club Facebook page and inclusive information on the website.

But can we do more now that we realise just how important the social aspect of the club really is?

I proudly wear my club T shirt to many non-club venues but we currently don't have stock for new members. Volunteers to redress (pun always intended) this would be eagerly supported!

Like most sporting clubs, the physical challenges of the sport make it increasingly difficult to participate as we age. Our club is no different and it's such a shame to see members drift away as they age when they probably need us the most. In a recent club meeting discussion, there was a suggestion made about a discount membership fee for non-boat owners. Carol (and John) Parker stated that they happily pay the annual membership fee as the club is still important to them even though they needed to recently sell their much loved boat. There are practical reasons why a non boat discount is not possible, but the better question could be "How do we add value for now non boat members and how do we still keep them involved?"

We currently don't have anyone filling the Social Coordinator role. The role is far more important than just catering logistics. It facilitates social connections and we need to value and support it as such.

Our monthly club meetings are declining in attendance. This year we will be discussing whether we still need to be meeting at a live venue or just running as a Zoom. In my opinion, our meetings have drifted into being more administrative and reporting. During the Covid lockdown, when connection became so important, I had organised presentations at each meeting on various topics such as boat insurance through to vacuum packing of food (thanks Kim). It took a bit of work and I wasn't Race Officer at the time. But is it worth considering enhancing the social aspect of the monthly meetings that would work both in a live and Zoom setting?

So what do you think? We are a diverse bunch with different backgrounds, preferences and needs. However, your contribution to the club, in whatever way you can make it, is just so valuable to us all and we all benefit.

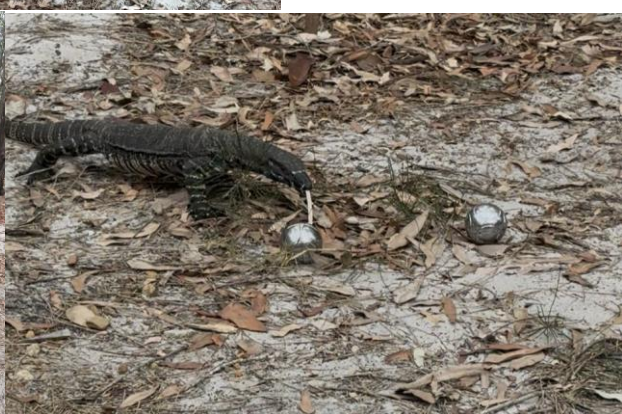

NOTICE OF RACE – Autumn Series 2026 v1

1 RULES

- 1.1 The races will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, the Prescriptions and Special Regulations of Australian Sailing Category 7 and any amendments, each yacht's Class Rules (except where any of these are altered by the Sailing Instructions), and the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2 All races will be "Mixed Class Races" and spinnakers may be flown.
- 1.3 Each race is required to have a minimum of 4 boats signed on to start the race (excluding the Officer of the Day). If less than 4, the race will not be part of the race series.

2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Advertising will be restricted to Category A as noted in Clause 80.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The races are open to all NHTYA members and visitors.

4 FEES

- 4.1 Required fees are as follows: 10 Race Series \$40.00, or \$10 per race till \$40.00 has been accrued. Fees are to be paid prior to participating in any race or the yacht will be scored DSQ.

5 RACE SERIES

- 5.1 The race series will consist of 10 races.

6 SCHEDULE

- 6.1 Registration is on the day of the race prior to briefing time. The scheduled time of the warning signal for the race briefing is Saturday 11.30am and Sunday 10.30am.
- 6.2 Dates of racing 2026, and designated OOD:

6.3 Number of races:

Division Numbers	Races per day
Divisions 1 to 3	One race on Saturdays and one race on Sundays. Except re-run races conducted as a second race on the next Saturday race day, or Sunday race day if required.

7 EQUIPMENT and MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 7.1 A boat or its equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the Sailing Instructions. On the water a boat may be instructed by a Race Committee Officer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

8 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 8.1 The sailing instructions will be available on the NHTYA web site www.trailersailer.org

9 VENUE

- 9.1 The races will be conducted on Lake Macquarie in New South Wales.
- 9.2 The venue will be Styles Point for races 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 6 and F-Jetty for races 7, 8, 9 and 10. F Jetty races can be accessed by the ramp adjacent to F Jetty.
- 9.3 Directions for visitors: F-Jetty is at Rathmines NSW and is accessed by Dorrington Road or Stilling Street, with trailer yacht launching at Styles Point ramp. Styles Point is at Rathmines NSW and is accessed by Dorrington Road then Overhill Road. At the northern end of Overhill Road take the right turn into the park.

10 THE COURSES

- 10.1 The courses to be sailed will be selected from the Club Courses or as determined at the race briefing. (see the Sailing Instructions Addendum B). The race organiser will use the B.O.M/Meteye site for weather assessments.

11 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 11.1 Rule 44.1 (page 29) is changed so that the "Two Turn Penalty" is replaced by the "One Turn Penalty".

12 SCORING

- 12.1 The primary scoring system will be based on personal handicap (PHC) results utilising the "Top Yacht Club Score" software.
- 12.2 The secondary scoring system will be based on Class Basic Handicap (CBH) results utilising the "Top Yacht" software and is to be calculated by utilising each boat's elapsed time for each race conducted within the 2025 Spring Series and the 2026 Autumn Series and multiplied by the CBH for that class of boat. 80% of the best results for that boat to count towards the series. Class handicap ratings for the combined Spring and Autumn series will be those published on the NHTYA website at the date of the first Spring race.
- 12.3 In consultation with the Sailing Committee, and upon review of previous season's CBH race results, some minor CBH rating adjustments may be made by the Club Handicapper in order to address rating anomalies.
- 12.4 Low point scoring system described in A4.1 will apply.
- 12.5 The Officer of the Day (OOD) shall be scored as a DUTY boat. DUTY boat can only be awarded on one occasion each series. Occasion being meant as one day's racing activities.
- 12.6 Any NHTYA Club Member absent from an NHTYA race because they are participating in another club's race on the same day will be scored as a "DUTY" boat and receive an average of her 4 best scores. This can only be applied once per race series.
- 12.7 Any Series Ties to be resolved using clause A8.

13 THE START and SUPPORT BOATS

- 13.1 The start will be between an Association buoy and a flag on the start boat, unless otherwise notified at the briefing. Committee Boats will be used as support boats as required.

14 RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

- 14.1 All boats will monitor VHF Channel 72 while racing. A boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. The club call sign is "Catalina Fleet".

15 PRIZES

- 15.1 Prizes will be given as follows:
- Medal for 1st, 2nd & 3rd in each race on PHC.
- 15.2 Trophies as follows:
- Winner of the Spring 2025 Series based on PHC.
 - Winner of the combined Spring 2025 & Autumn 2026 Series based on PHC.
 - Winner of the combined Spring 2025 and Autumn 2025 Series based on CBH.
- 15.3 The crew of a prize winning boat (not being a spouse/partner of the owner):
- Having paid club membership, and
 - Having paid race fees, and
 - Participated in a minimum of 80% of the races on that boat in that series shall be eligible for an individual award.

16 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 16.1 Competitors participate in races entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with, prior to, during, or after the series races.

17 INSURANCE

- 17.1 Each participating boat shall be insured with a valid third-party liability insurer with a minimum cover of \$10,000,000.00 per event or the equivalent.

18 PERSON IN CHARGE

- 18.1 All yacht skippers must have current:
- Sailing Australia membership.
 - Race fees paid.
 - Members of NHTYA must have current NHTYA club membership.
 - Failing any of these, the yacht will be scored as DSQ (Disqualified).
